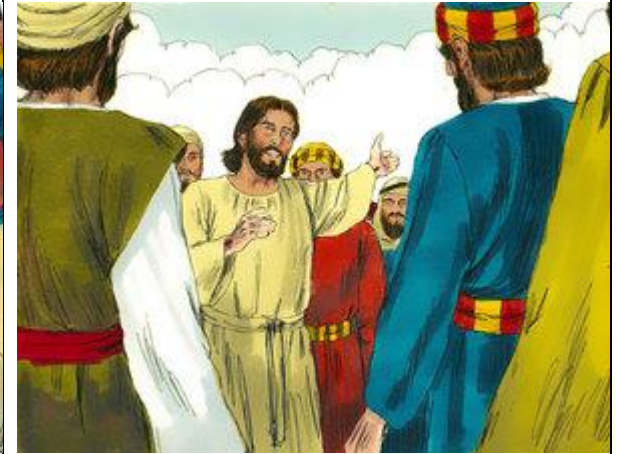
Jesus is a teacher.

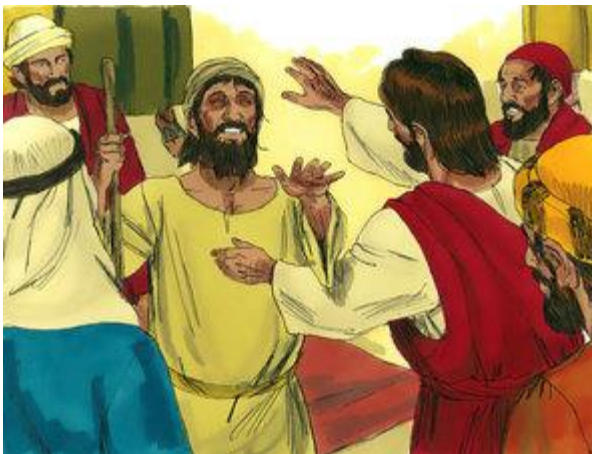
He has many **followers**.

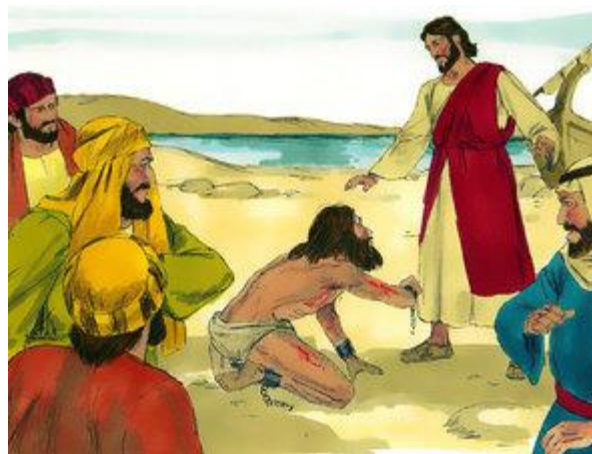
He teaches about God.

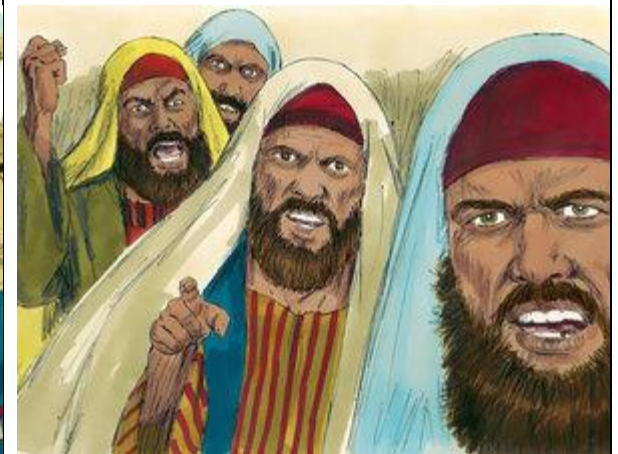
He does many **miracles**.

Jesus (Cisse)

Suggestions:

Before reading, ask what the reader already knows about Jesus. Ask to share what you know. Share that there is a big holiday coming up, and this is what that day is really about.

Teach the words on the word list before reading the story. Use the pictures to clarify the meaning of the words in bold. Read the story a couple more times without stopping, for fluency.

Have the student retell the story to you in his or her own words. You can tell it together if it is difficult. A “retell” doesn’t use every word of the story. It is used to check understanding, not memorization. An easy structure is to talk about what happened in the beginning (characters and setting), middle, and end.

The bible.is app can be downloaded to your phone. Ask the student if he or she wants to hear the story in their native language.

If the student is comfortable with the story, use the last page “Who is Jesus?” that explains more about Jesus.
